DIRECTOR'S NOTES

This is my second time directing at Laurel Mill, and I am very excited to be presenting *Miss Evers' Boys*, especially during Black History Month.

Miss Evers' Boys tells the story of the Tuskegee Study of Untreated Syphilis in the Negro Male (also called the Tuskegee Study). The Tuskegee Study first came to my attention as a graduate student in public health. It was used as an example of what can happen when well-meaning people make decisions that can have dire, unpredicted, consequences. It was also an example of how stereotypes, ignorance, and assumptions about racial differences affect the delivery of health care and therefore affect the well-being of entire populations. The decisions made during the Tuskegee Study still affect the healthcare delivery system today. Even now, the disparities in the availability and quality of care for African Americans are still apparent. And many African Americans continue to be reluctant to trust the US Healthcare System, as a consequence of Tuskegee and other "experiments" in which Black patients were used as "guinea pigs".

The play is driven by the fictional character of Eunice Evers, who is based on Eunice Rivers, the real-life nurse who worked in the Tuskegee Study. In some scenes Nurse Evers goes back and forth from working in the study, to testifying before a Senate subcommittee forty years later in 1972. The Senate subcommittee was charged with investigating the Study, after a reporter exposed some unethical actions on the part of the Tuskegee Study investigators.

Today we have laws in place that guarantee the fair and ethical treatment of participants in clinical trials – laws that require, among other things, informed consent. The subjects in the Tuskegee Study were not given information about their true diagnosis and were misled about the consequences and prognosis of syphilis.

The play is a fictional account of the Tuskegee Study of Untreated Syphilis in the Negro Male. Fictional in the sense that these characters did not exist, however the events they speak of, and the decisions behind the events, are true. My desire is to call attention to incidents such as this, in the hopes of increasing our understanding of the realities of Black History in the United States.
